To the Parent or Guardian of 6 North students:

The Johnson County Department of Health and Environment notified us that your child may have had low-risk contact with someone who is presumed positive for COVID-19. **You do not need to take any additional precautions at this time.** The school and JCDHE will continue monitoring the situation closely and will notify you if circumstances change and your child needs to quarantine. You will also receive a copy of the general school communication regarding this matter.

Low-risk exposures may include any of the following, among others:

- Being in the same classroom with proper mask wearing;
- Riding the same bus with mask wearing, ventilation as practicable, and/or social distancing; and/or
- Playground exposure with social distancing and other measures in place.

However, COVID-19 is circulating at high levels in our community and everyone should be washing their hands with soap and water frequently, wearing a mask in public, and maintaining six feet of physical distance to prevent its spread. This is especially important because people can spread coronavirus before they start feeling sick.

Although the risk of your child developing COVID-19 based on this exposure is low, watch for symptoms of COVID-19. Symptoms include, but are not limited to, fever, cough, loss of smell and/or taste, chills, fatigue, loss of appetite, shortness of breath, muscle aches, chest pain, headache, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, sore throat, and runny nose. If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 disease during the next 14 days, please notify your health care provider and your school nurse.
